

ACCELERATED BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (BSN)

Our accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) is a 12 month accelerated college nursing degree program for individuals who already have a 4 year bachelor degree from an accredited college or university.

To apply to our program, the first step is to make an appointment with a UNMC Student Services Advisor. They will help you evaluate which courses will transfer and which pre-requisite courses you will need to complete. The pre-requisites can be taken at any accredited community college, college, or university. All must be completed before entering the program. Most online and independent study courses from an accredited college or university will be accepted for transfer. The accelerated BSN program is a full-time plan of study and may include clinical rotations on evenings and/or weekends.

The accelerated program begins in January on both the Omaha and Lincoln campuses and every other year in Scottsbluff. All application materials including the application, fee, official transcripts, references, and a disclosure statement are due by the application deadline of May 15. An interview may be conducted.

*Math competency includes one of the items below:

- 1) A math score of 22 or greater on the ACT
- 2) An acceptable decision score for ASSET (36), Compass (32) or other equivalent college math placement test
- 3) Grade of C or better on intermediate college algebra, college algebra, or any other math course that demonstrates readiness for college algebra

** The required elective includes **ONE additional course** from only **ONE** of the following categories:

Humanities: Provides knowledge of the history or creation of music, art or knowledge of literary, philosophical or religious efforts.

Political Science/Social organization: Provides knowledge of the structure or governance of societies, economics, urban, agricultural, industrial or the natural environment.

Family & Human Behavior: Provides knowledge of individual, family or group behavior.

Culture, race, ethnicity, gender: Provides knowledge on social experiences or creative works on diversity in the U.S. or the world.

Instead of one of these courses, a student may choose a course in either genetics or immunology.
