EQUIPMENT: PAPR AND HOOD, BATTERIES, FILTERS, DUCT TAPE, SUIT, INNER BOOTS, OUTER BOOTS, INNER GLOVES, OUTER GLOVES

02



CAREFULLY INSPECT THE SEAMS OF THE SUIT FOR TEARS OR BROKEN SEALS

03



REMOVE CAPS FROM BOTH SIDES OF FILTER

04



ATTACH FILTERS TO PAPR

05



TEST PAPR MOTOR USING AIR FLOW METER

DONNING PARTNER TAKES AND RECORDS VITAL SIGNS

DRINK 1-2 GLASSES OF A NON-CAFEINATED BEVERAGE

REMOVE ALL JEWELRY AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

APPLY BOOT LINERS TO BOTH FEET AND TAPE TO OUTER SURFACE OF PANTS

CREATE A TAB ON THE TAPE'S END TO AID IN LATER DOFFING

STEP INTO SUIT AND PULL UP TO WAIST LEVEL

APPLY OUTER RUBBER BOOTS OVER SUIT. THE RUBBER GRIPS SHOULD BE ALONG THE BOTTOM TO IMPROVE TRACTION

TAPE BOOTS ALONG UPPER RIM SEALING THEM TO THE SUIT

REMOVE AND SEAL THE LOWER PORTION OF THE ZIPPER TAPE

APPLY THE OUTER GLOVES.

CAREFULLY TUCK THE CUFF OF THE SUIT INSIDE

TAPE GLOVE ALONG UPPER RIM SEALING THE GLOVE TO THE SUIT

CREATE A TAB ON THE TAPE'S END TO AID IN LATER DOFFING

APPLY PATIENT CARE GLOVES FOR ADDITIONAL DEXTERITY

ATTACH THE HOOD TUBING TO THE PAPR MOTOR

TURN ON THE MOTOR AND PUT THE HOOD ON

TUCK THE INNER SHROUD INTO THE SUIT'S NECK



25

CLOSE THE ZIPPER ALL THE WAY TO THE NECK AND SEAL THE SUIT FLAP

FLATTEN OUTER FLAP OF HOOD OVER SHOULDERS



IMPORTANT

THE SUPPORT TEAM SHOULD BE AWARE OF HAND SIGNALS USED WHILE IN THE SUIT



PATting THE HEAD INDICATES NEEDING OUT OF THE SUIT



PUTTING HANDS AT THE NECK SIGNIFIES INABILITY TO BREATHE
